
News at a glance

Students from Thomas Clarkson Academy took part in a business challenge to run their own company. High achieving students from Years 7 and 8 on the Kroto programme, took part in the event delivered by the Skills Service and supported by staff from Perkins and TCA.

They learned to make origami ducks and team members were given company roles and money to start up their business, which consisted of buying

materials, making ducks and negotiating sales to buyers.

Although the event took place over a few hours it simulated five working days,

so teams had to pay wages and rent. They could also earn bonuses for good performance or be fined for breaking rules.
