
## CELEBRATION ASSEMBLY





As we're spending so much time at home relying on technology, Year 6 have been learning about their digital wellbeing.


The children were asked to create posters that give people information on how to be healthy online.

She has loaded the dishwasher and done the washing up.. just look at the before and after pictures!!












Aarya and her mum have made scary Gruffalo with Play Doh. They couldn't wait to share their finished product with everyone!



Ethan in Year 5 has been working hard to remind us all how to keep safe when out and about near the roads. Great advice Ethan!



On Monday, Rainbow went on a walk to collect items for our nature freeze cups. We can't wait to find out what happens to them tomorrow!








Here are our finished products...We were very impressed to look at the frozen nature! We measured the time taken for the cups to melt...3 hours,14 minutes!








## Here is some Geography work by Ethan Britain (Kingfishers).


He created a poster on human and physical geographical features for England, and used specific examples of these features in England, and drew amazing pictures. He used great vocabulary too, such as 'iconic'.

Lots of cookery has been taking place in homes this week and it all looks delicious!


Looks like Edvard in Year 6 has been very busy this week, taking care of some very special new arrivals in his home!


